Purpose of project:

Improving the path network of Bedelands Farm LNR and Railway Land North. The path through the reserve is to provide a circular, all weather route. On Railway Land North a surfaced path will be provided to formalise the desire line that is currently used by visitors across the site.

Value For Money Assessment:

Current practice / doing nothing:

The network of paths on the Bedelands Farm LNR have been laid for a number of years and is in need of upgrading. An all-weather circular path has been noted as desirable for access to the reserve and has relied on nominated paths rather than an constructed route. It is intended that the route will cater for equal access for a wide range of abilities. The path across Railway Land North that is currently a muddy desire line, but improves links to Bedelands Farm with a route from the station up to the reserve.

Other alternative approaches:

The project is part of a wider consultation that Lewes DC undertook on completion of the Theobolds development that is adjacent to Valebridge Road, but within Lewes District Council boundary. MSDC agreed to accept the priorities of their consultation.
