Purpose of Report

 Mid Sussex District Council (MSDC) is requesting the release of S106 Local Community Infrastructure (LCI) contributions to improve the pond and enhance the surrounding area at the Royal George Recreation Ground.

Recommendation

 It is recommended that £3,820.70 be released to MSDC from Local Community Infrastructure contributions arising from the development at land on the eastern side of Manor Road (P35/716).

Background

- 3. The pond within Royal George Recreation Grounds is a breeding site for the Great Crested Newt. Every year the water level drops causing the pond to dry out. This is due, in part, to the Willow trees surrounding the pond.
- 4. MSDC plan to remove the surrounding trees and install a French drain running from the basketball courts down the hill to the pond. This would increase the rainfall caught and reduce *water* loss, therefore allowing moisture to remain in the pond for a longer period of the year thus providing a better environment for the Newts to breed.
- 5. The Coppice beside the Pond has had several reports of dens being built and loud music and drinking late into the night. In an attempt to reduce this anti-social behavior the trees will have the lower branches cut back exposing the area beneath them.
