24. RICHARD WORSLEY RECREATION GROUND CHARITABLE TRUST, CUCKFIELD, WEST SUSSEX CHARITY NUMBER206789 PROPOSED LEASE DISPOSALS

Tom Clark, Solicitor to the Council introduced the report and asked the Trustees to consider a request from Cuckfield Lawn Tennis Club who wish to take a lease of the three tennis courts at the Park and a new lease of the land adjacent on which the Club's pavilion is situated, at a revised rent.

Councillor Salisbury, as ward Member, expressed concern about how the land would be used and pointed out that there had been no formal public consultation on the proposal. He added that the Charity Trustees had a duty to the public at large rather than a select group. He also questioned the proposed 28 year lease and reminded Members that the Charity Trustees already have a maintenance programme for the tennis courts and that no alternative had been proposed by the Club. He then proposed that the first recommendation to note the contents of the report and the Independent Surveyor's report should stand, and that the second recommendation be substituted by the following: "It is not the wish of the Charity Trustees to continue with this proposal at this time because we do not believe it properly reflects the benefit and right of access to the public at large as required by the Charity Commissioners."

This was seconded by Councillor Anne Jones.

Responding to another Member's question, the Solicitor to the Council confirmed that if the proposal was supported the statutory process would be followed which would involve contact with the Charity Commission.

As there were no further questions, the Chairman took Members to the motion, which was agreed.

- (2) it is not the wish of the Charity Trustees to continue with the proposal at this time because they do not believe it properly reflects the benefit and right of access to the public at large as required by the Charity Commissioners.
