Information and News

COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have fallen slightly to about 280 cases per 100,000 in the last week which is around the level we had in early July 2021 and therefore remains high and caution is still needed in indoor settings. Hospitalisations locally are rising slowly and deaths from Covid remain low but more regular.

Average Covid rates across West Sussex have also fallen to about 280 cases per 100,000 with the spike in Covid rates in Chichester coming down well below 400 cases per 100,000 in the last week. The average Covid figure in England has also fallen a little in the last week to about 315 cases per 100,000. The average Covid rate in the South East has also fallen back to where it was two weeks ago to about 290 cases per 100,000 with rates in East Sussex now similar to those in West Sussex.

In most areas of England Covid rates remain below 400 cases per 100,000 but in popular holiday locations such as Devon and Cornwall they are now above 400 cases per 100,000. Rates in Scotland and Wales have risen rapidly in the last week with many areas in Scotland now having rates above 400 cases per 100,000 with schools having gone back in the last 2 weeks in Scotland.

Lateral flow tests are available free to collect locally or request online by post so everyone can check their Covid status and take a PCR test if the lateral flow test indicates a Covid positive result.

People who are not double vaccinated are still required to self- isolate if they are asked to do so by Test and Trace or if they have been in recent close contact with someone who goes on to test positive



for Covid. Those double vaccinated or under 18 are recommended to get a free PCR test in these circumstances but need only self- isolate if that test is positive.

About 80% of the adult population in England and in Mid Sussex are now double vaccinated and about 89% of the adult population have received a first vaccination.

All people 16 and over are now eligible for a Covid vaccination jab with the second vaccinations being done after 8 weeks.
