Summary of the Emergency Planning Liaison Group Meeting held on Wednesday 20th March 2013 at Mid Sussex District Council Offices

The District Council has a duty under the Civil Contingencies Act to provide assistance to the emergency services, should a major incident be declared in Mid Sussex. A major incident is defined as an event or situation which threatens serious damage to human welfare or the environment or war, or terrorism, which threatens serious damage to the security of the United Kingdom.

The EPLG is made up of representatives of the Town and Parish Councils, various MSDC officers, the Council's Corporate & Public Safety Consultant and other officers from the Sussex Resilience Forum Partners including WSCC, Sussex Police, West Sussex Fire & Rescue, the Environment Agency, Brighton &

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Sussex University NHS Hospital Trust, Sussex Community NHS Trust and the South East Coast Ambulance Service (SECAMB).

The EPLG meet once a quarter to provide updates from the area and discuss any matters that have occurred or may cause a major incident.

During the latest meeting MSDC reported a water main burst at a recreation ground in Burgess Hill on 6th December 2012 causing flooding to neighbouring properties and 5000 homes without water but the matter was repaired swiftly. There was a fire at a thatched property in Warninglid and very wet weather between the 21st and 27th December caused flooding to properties in Balcombe, Hurstpierpoint and the Hickstead Hotel. A large number of the public contacted the Fire and Rescue Service with their concerns about gas leaks, until it was confirmed that there was in fact a gas release from Normandy! Then of course there was the snow in January and again on the 10th and 11th March.

Other colleagues from the Sussex Resilience Forum Partners also provided updates:

Justin Cuckow (West Sussex County Council) provided some notes for the group about the **Fire & Rescue Resilience Team merger** which is forming a Resilience and Emergencies Team on 1st April, to be based in Chichester FRS Headquarters. The notes also referred to **Community Emergency Plans**, which will provide a structure for emergency planning of all hazards and will have annexes for winter maintenance, flooding and other risks. Additionally, a winter management template is being reviewed for which comments are being collated.

Rob Johnson (West Sussex Fire & Rescue) spoke of the recent snow that caused very heavy traffic congestion and major problems on A23, M23 & A27. Crews were out all night trying to clear a route for ploughs and gritters and also checking the welfare of the public.

Ben Toogood (MSDC) highlighted the close relationship between the Fire Service and the Red Cross, known as the Fire & Emergency Support Service (FESS). This is run by volunteers on call to the Fire Service (24/7 365 days a year), who have access to insurance companies, cover fire fighter welfare when working for extreme periods of time and also assist with the welfare of people isolated during matters like large powercuts.

Natasza Lentner (NHS) confirmed huge pressures within the NHS but they are currently trying to promote a new campaign for a new emergency number 111 (TBC).

The Severe Weather Plan was tested again during the recent snow.

Town & Parish Councils made good use of the 100 snow kits that MSDC issued.

Town & Parish representatives expressed their disappointment with WSCC, considering the amount of advance warning of heavy snow, with regards to delivery of hippo bags, no snow ploughs or gritters were seen and insufficient grit was laid.

Justin Cuckow provided a statement to confirm that WSCC gritted the streets on the Sunday night, twice during the day on Monday, commenced a third run at 7pm and had planned another for 2am.

Dry snow and strong winds caused drifting, which led to cars going off the road, people abandoning cars and a number of trees were down on A283 and elsewhere, causing traffic jams. This meant timings were dropped, gritters operated on a back to back basis for 24 hours but could not complete their routes.

A Sussex Resilience Forum debrief will look at this snow incident in detail to ensure lessons are learnt.

MSDC's Wellbeing Manager, Elizabeth Carter explained how the Wellbeing Group have been working with residents to prevent ill health. They provide free lifestyle advice to stop smoking, lose weight, eat well, exercise, reduce stress levels and help with alcohol and substance misuse.

The Group would like to reach further into communities with the help of Town & Parish Councils in spreading the word about this service and have offered to attend their meetings.

Traveller Incursions is the most recent addition to the EPLG agenda. MSDC officers have been looking at ways to improve and agree written procedures to be followed for traveller incursions and have created a new flow chart to assist in this process.

The Council's Communications team is now responsible for dealing with the public and communication to Members through the Customer Services team and use a new standard form to log each occurrence of traveller incursion. A new dedicated traveller line 01444 477254 is to be communicated to the public, along with the email address travellers@midsussex.gov.uk and these will also be updated to the Council's website.

The Group discussed what actions are taken during various issues that may occur during an incursion and the role of Town and Parish Councils in dealing with incursions on their land.
