UK Shared Prosperity Fund

MSDC is delighted to have secured £1 million in funding via the Government's UK Shared Prosperity Fund and we have set up an investment plan to improve our local parks and community hubs. The investment plan sets money aside to help:

- Sussex Clubs for Young People to utilise an expanded pavilion at Barns Cottage green and grow the services provided by the Bentswood Community Hub
- Mid Sussex Voluntary Action with their support for the community from the Cherry Tree centre in Burgess Hill
- The Quarry cafe and community fridge in East Grinstead relocate to new premises and expand their range of services
- Support the parks masterplan to improve play facilities and sports provision at Parks across Burgess Hill, East Grinstead and Haywards Heath
- Support young people not in education, employment or training (NEET)

This fund helps us enhance our local area and ensures Mid Sussex remains a place we are proud to live and work in.

COVID-19 News

Covid is now endemic, and we are working to live with it. Covid rates in West Sussex and across the UK has gradually risen during the festive period and remains high compared with previous months. The West Sussex rate now averages about 93.3 cases per 100,000.



The best way to avoid serious illness from a Covid infection is to maintain the benefits of vaccination. Everyone aged 5 and over is eligible for a Covid vaccination. Booster vaccinations are available for all those aged 50 years plus or otherwise vulnerable. These booster vaccinations are now being carried out at Clair Hall and across West Sussex. They can be booked online or at some places a walk-in service is available.

Flu vaccinations are also well underway with walk-ins at many pharmacies.
