

## MSDC Summer Holiday programme for families 2023

The MSDC Play Days on Tour Summer 2023 programme will be visiting 10 locations across the district running from 1 - 3 p.m. twice a week throughout the school summer holidays. This programme delivers free activities for children and families providing a range of activities including music, arts, circus skills and sports. Working in partnership with the Town and Parish Councils and local organisations by providing an activity whilst having the opportunity to promote their offer. The target age is under 10's but all children and young people can attend.



Following a review of locations in consultation with MSDC Officers and partners, Cllr Norman Webster has agreed to the change of site for Haywards Heath from Barn Cottage to Clair Park to widen the access for residents. I am waiting to have discussions with Copthorne Parish Council to agree the location for this village.

## Voter Authority Certificate: Easy Read Guide Published

On 6 March, DLUHC published an easy read guide to help individuals to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate.

From 4 May, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections. This will apply to:

- Local elections
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections
- UK parliamentary by-elections
- Recall petitions
- From October 2023, it will also apply to UK general elections.

Individuals who don't have an accepted photo ID can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

Further information about accepted forms of photo ID, how to apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate, and what to expect on polling day can be found below.

The Electoral Commission is aware that some groups are more likely to experience barriers with this change and may need support to access photo ID. Organisations working directly with voters, including councils and charities, are encouraged to help voters make sure they have the correct photo ID ahead of the elections.

The Electoral Commission has produced partner packs for organisations in England, including councils, to help them raise awareness and support voters with applying for a



Voter Authority Certificate. The packs also include information on voter registration. Resources have also been produced to help those who are likely to need support with the new voter ID requirement.

Councils are encouraged to share this information as appropriate.

## Public Encouraged to Add Coronation Events to Digital Map

Members of the public and community organisations across the UK have been invited by the government to share how they will celebrate the Coronation on a digital map launched on 4 March. The map can be found on the Coronation website, linked below.

The map is designed to encourage people to add their own Coronation Big Lunches, street parties, Big Help Out plans and other Coronation activities so others in the local community can find out about events near them and get involved.

The Coronation website also includes information for getting involved, a toolkit including templates, a playlist, recipes, and designs.

The Coronation will take place on the morning of 6 May at Westminster Abbey, London, and will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Throughout the UK, Coronation Big Lunches will bring communities together on 7 May, and Big Lunch packs for residents are now available to download, linked below. Street parties will also take place across the weekend.

The weekend of celebrations will end with the Big Help Out on 8 May, which will highlight the impact of volunteering. # Planning Guidance: March Newsletter to Chief Planning Officers

On 3 March, DLUHC issued a newsletter to chief planning officers of local planning authorities in England with details of the latest announcements from DLUHC and other government departments and agencies relating to planning practice and policy.

The newsletter highlights two consultations: 'Stronger Performance of Local Planning Authorities (LPA) supported through an increase in Planning Fees' and 'Permitted development rights: supporting temporary recreational campsites, renewable energy and film-making consultation'

Updates also include the launch of the government's Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects action plan for reforming the consenting process and the Competition and Market Authority has



launched a market study on house building. There's is a reminder for LPAs to engage with their local water companies on the forthcoming 2024 Water Resources Management Plans.

#### Rural Roads Targeted in New Safety Campaign

Drivers are being urged by road safety experts to think about the dangers of driving too fast for road conditions in a new THINK! campaign that launched on 6 March.

The new campaign, "Is pushing it worth it?" is targeted at young male drivers, as statistics show male drivers aged 17 to 24 are four times more likely to be killed or seriously injured than drivers aged 25 or over.

Alongside the campaign, the government continues to consider how to enhance road safety, with a particular focus on rural roads. As part of the Safer Roads Fund, the government, together with councils and safety groups, is continuing to deliver improvements across rural roads.

To date, £100 million has been provided through the programme to improve the 50 most dangerous roads in England, the majority of which are rural roads. Some of the improvements made include improved signage, safer pedestrian crossings and better designed junctions.

#### COVID-19 News

Covid is now endemic, and we are working to live with it. Covid rates in West Sussex and across the UK had dropped significantly since the start of the year. The West Sussex rate now averages about 21.8 cases per 100,000.

The best way to avoid serious illness from a Covid infection is to maintain the benefits of vaccination. Everyone aged 5 and over is eligible for a Covid vaccination. Booster vaccinations are available for all those aged 50 years plus or otherwise vulnerable. They can be booked online or at some places a walk-in service is available.
