LGA annual conference 2023: Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities' speech

On 4 July, the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, Rt Hon Michael Gove MP, <u>gave a speech at the Local Government Association's (LGA's) annual conference 2023 in Bournemouth</u>.

Prior to his speech, a <u>Written Ministerial Statement was tabled in Parliament</u>. In his speech, he announced the <u>establishment of the Office for Local Government (Oflog)</u>, a new local government <u>performance body in England</u>. Oflog will provide authoritative and accessible data and analysis about the performance of local government and support its improvement.

DLUHC has also published <u>a policy document, setting out the plans for Oflog in more detail</u>. Further information on Oflog can be found on GOV.UK. The <u>Local Authority Data Explorer online tool</u>, which brings together a selection of existing metrics across a subset of service areas for data that is available at different levels of local authority, was also published today on GOV.UK. The Data Explorer initially covers four sets of metrics; these are a first step and over time Oflog will be looking to expand on and iterate these metrics to cover the range of local government responsibilities.



DLUHC has also launched a <u>recruitment campaign for the Office for Local Government Chief Executive</u> <u>Officer role.</u> The deadline to submit an application is 11:55pm on 13 August.

Alongside the establishment of Oflog, DLUHC has also launched a <u>consultation into new statutory</u> <u>guidance on what constitutes Best Value and the standards authorities are expected to meet by the</u> <u>government and residents</u>.

Community Automated External Defibrillators Fund and National Defibrillator Network Database

As of 28 June, organisations in England are being invited to bid for a share of £1 million of government funding to buy defibrillators for community spaces like town halls, local parks or post offices.

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) is <u>inviting interested organisations to register</u> expressions of interest for its Community Automated External Defibrillators (AED) Fund, aimed at increasing the number of AEDs in public places.

An estimated 1,000 new defibrillators are to be provided by the fund. As part of the grant award, applicants will be asked to demonstrate that defibrillators will be placed in areas where they are most needed, such as places with high footfall, vulnerable people, rural areas, or due to the nature of activity at the site.

Examples could include town halls, community centres, local shops, post offices and local parks, to ensure that defibrillators are evenly spread throughout communities.

DHSC wrote to councils yesterday about registering defibrillators on 'The Circuit', the national defibrillator network database, which provides information on where defibrillators are located. Registering a defibrillator with 'The Circuit' enables emergency services, including first responders, to locate the nearest AEDs when they are treating someone out of hospital for sudden cardiac arrest. <u>AED registration</u> is simple and quick to do.

Councils are encouraged to disseminate this information to parish and town councils, in addition to as many organisations as possible within your council who may have unregistered AEDs.

Homes England Review Announced

On the 26 June, DLUHC announced <u>a review of Homes England</u>, one of 40 government Arm's Length Bodies chosen for a routine review as part of the Cabinet Office's Public Bodies Review programme.

Homes England was last reviewed in 2016 under the Tailored Review Programme and the work, leadership, structure, and objectives of the agency have evolved considerably since 2016.

The review will examine Homes England's current ways of working, focusing on its structure, compliance and outcomes for stakeholders and customers. How DLUHC works with Homes England will also be reviewed.

The review team will consult with a range of stakeholders, including councils, and will issue further information on its engagement in due course. It is expected to finalise the review and its recommendations by the end of the year.
