Release of S106 Formal Sports Contributions for installation of electronic access gate at John Pears Recreation Ground tennis courts

Census 2021 will provide a snapshot of modern society

Households across Mid Sussex will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021.

The official Census day will be on March 21. It will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets from early March

The census will include questions about sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity.

A successful census is critical to ensuring our communities receive the funding and support that they deserve over the next decade. Nationally, councils play an important role in supporting the delivery of the Census with essential local knowledge. Members will be pleased to know that MSDC officers are already working with the local Census Engagement Manager, appointed by the Office for National Statistics, covering Mid Sussex, Horsham and Crawley.

As part of the wider community engagement exercise that the Council is providing support for, the Census Engagement Manager will shortly be contacting members directly to provide background information to help you understand the Census process in more detail and allow you to better direct constituent enquiries that you may receive in March. Please look out for the communication.
