Background information

The South of England Agricultural Society (SEAS) is a registered charity whose aims are to showcase farming, agriculture and the countryside through annual seasonal country shows and events. It operates from the South of England showground, a 150 acre site situated just outside Ardingly village.

The competition is open to anyone studying in the South East, aged 14-21 years and can be working in any medium e.g. wood, metal, ceramics, textiles and design & technology. 2017 will be the 30th year of the Young Craftsman competition.

This event embraces tow of the South of England Agricultural Society's objectives, namely to promote crafts and skills and encourage young people to stretch themselves and produce work of the highest standards. Judges will be looking for craftsmanship and marks will be awarded for concept and design, use of materials, technical skills, finish, artistic merit, function, balance and proportion, and the potential in the competitor for further development of their craft or skill.

The Awards are showcased on the Tuesday 6 June before the start of the annual South of England Show at Ardingly. The presentation of awards and prizes takes place on the Saturday of the show. Mid Sussex District Council will be credited as a supporter on promotional material.
