Purpose of Report

1. Approval is sought to release S106 Formal Sport contributions to provide-surface regeneration works to Hickmans Lane recreation ground cricket square.

Recommendation

2. It is recommended that £7,000 be released from formal sport contributions arising from the developments at land north at newton Road (P35/662).

Background

- 3. Hickmans Lane recreation ground has been home to senior and junior teams of Lindfield Cricket Club for over a decade.
- 4. The club offers recreational and competitive cricket for all age groups. They have over 80 senior players plus an expanding youth academy which currently coaches over 200 boys & girls
- 5. Over the last few years the club have raised concerns about the deterioration of the grass cricket square, with numerous reports of cricket balls bouncing dangerously and unpredictably off the surface which is very detrimental to the senior teams but more importantly the junior teams and the clubs raise concerns on a regular basis about the unplayable pitch condition.
- 6. At the end of this current season they are looking at the possibility to ground share with another club on a non-MSDC site.
- 7. The proposal is to carry out surface regeneration works to the square which will ensure that the grass wicket is majorly improved and will be able to be used for a long time for future cricket fixtures.

Financial Implications

8. This project is considered to represent an appropriate expenditure for formal sport contributions from the agreements overleaf.

Legal Implications

- 9. The planning permission for dwellings on land north at Newton Road secured financial contributions towards off site formal sport provision.
- 10. The project therefore conforms to the requirements of the S106 agreement and is considered appropriate expenditure.
- 11. The project is considered to be beneficial to improve the playability of the grass cricket wickets on this facility for the community cricket team that regularly hire the grounds for matches and training.
