COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have fallen to under 5 cases per 100,000 and therefore Mid Sussex has a similar infection rate as it had in July 2020. Covid rates have generally fallen across Sussex in the last week with no areas having a rate higher than the England average of 22 cases per 100,000. The average Covid rate in West Sussex is well below the South East average of about 12 cases per 100,000.

Covid levels in the last week across England generally are steady but there are a few areas in the north, the midlands and in London where rates have gone up very quickly with the rapid rise attributed to the Indian variant. Covid rates are well above 100 cases per 100,000 in some of these areas. Extra efforts are being made to keep Covid levels down in these areas with surge testing and additional vaccinations for all adults in these vulnerable areas and people are asked not to move in and out of these areas.

The third stage of the roadmap started on Monday 17th May 2021 with gyms/leisure centres, hotels and guest houses fully reopening, limited indoor home mixing and overnight stays and indoor service in pubs and restaurants. A leaflet is attached below explaining the advice to be cautious about meetings in private homes. Lateral Flow Tests are being used to identify people who have Covid but have no symptoms to try to maintain the low Covid rates now found in much of England. These free tests are available from local collection areas that can be located online or by requesting a postal delivery.



The roadmap envisages most Covid restrictions being lifted from 21st June 2021 subject to the four data tests being met. It is unclear at the moment how the presence of the Indian variant will affect what is permitted from 21st June 2021. This will be confirmed by the 14th June based on the England data. It is important people remember Hands Face Space and Fresh Air as more people are out and about.

Both Covid hospitalisations and Covid death rates are now as low in Sussex as they were last Summer.

The continuing local Covid vaccination programme will assist in keeping hospitalisations and Covid deaths down but there is a risk that the further lifting of restrictions allowing for more indoor social mixing and new variants of the Covid virus will push these figures in the opposite direction. The South African variant was identified twice in South London last month and surge testing took place on each occasion to seek to contain the outbreak. The Indian variant has been responsible for a rapid rise in cases in some areas as noted above.

All people aged 32 and over are now eligible to book their first vaccination and will be invited to book an appointment through their GP or they can book their appointment themselves online. Anybody 32+ who has not come forward previously for their first vaccination is urged to do so and get an appointment. Those over 30 are likely to be invited to come forward for a first vaccination by the end of this month, vaccination supply permitting. Vaccinations take a couple of weeks to fully take effect.

The vaccination of more medically vulnerable people aged 16 to 31 alongside the second vaccination for those people first vaccinated in March/April 2021 will also continue in June 2021. The second vaccination for people 50+ or vulnerable or an unpaid carer is being brought forward by up to 4 weeks from the end of this month which should ensure this group have received their second vaccine before 21st June 2021.
