COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have risen very rapidly in the last week to about 50 cases per 100,000 from very low levels we had in the middle of May 2021. Mid Sussex has a similar infection rate as it had in early March 2021 when cases were falling and had dropped from very high levels in January 2021. The increase case levels in Mid Sussex are concentrated in the under 29 population.

Covid rates have generally risen across West Sussex in the last week but with no areas having a rate higher than the increased England average of about 50 cases per 100,000. The average Covid rate in West Sussex is still below the South East average of about 35 cases per 100,000. Case levels in England and the South East have risen generally in the last week but currently East Sussex has maintained low Covid levels.

In most parts of Greater Manchester and Lancashire Covid rates are well above 100 cases per 100,000 with the Delta variant being dominant.

Extra efforts are being made to keep Covid levels down in hotspot areas with surge testing and additional vaccinations for all adults in these vulnerable areas and people are asked not to move in and out of these areas. These efforts have resulted in the case levels dropping in some of these areas with high levels of Covid



The third stage of the roadmap started on Monday 17th May 2021 with gyms/leisure centres ,hotels and guest houses fully reopening, limited indoor home mixing and overnight stays and indoor service in pubs and restaurants. A leaflet is attached below explaining the advice to be cautious about meetings in private homes. Lateral Flow Tests are being used to identify people who have Covid but have no symptoms to try to maintain the low Covid rates now found in much of England. These free tests are available from local collection areas that can be located online or by requesting a postal delivery. Additional indoor mixing over the past three weeks and the emergence of the Indian variant do seem to have resulted in an increase in Covid levels generally in England over the past week and particularly in Mid Sussex among younger people in the local population.

The roadmap envisages most Covid restrictions being lifted from 21st June 2021 subject to the four data tests being met. It is unclear at the moment how the presence of the Delta variant and rising case levels will affect what is permitted from 21st June 2021. This will be confirmed by the 14th June based on the England data. It is important people remember Hands Face Space and Fresh Air as more people are out and about. Both Covid hospitalisations and Covid death rates remain low in Sussex with no significant increase to date.

The continuing local Covid vaccination programme will assist in keeping hospitalisations and Covid deaths down but there is a risk that the further lifting of restrictions allowing for more indoor social mixing and new variants of the Covid virus will continue to push the Covid figures up.

All people aged 25 and over are now eligible to book their first vaccination and will be invited to book an appointment through their GP or they can book their appointment themselves online. Anybody 25+ who has not come forward previously for their first vaccination is urged to do so and get an appointment.

All those aged 18+ are likely to be invited to come forward for a first vaccination shortly, vaccination supply permitting. Vaccinations take a couple of weeks to fully take effect.

The vaccination of more medically vulnerable people aged 16 to 24 alongside the second vaccination for those people first vaccinated in April/May 2021 will also continue in June 2021. The second vaccination for people 50+ or vulnerable or an unpaid carer should be completed before 21st June 2021.

2023 Review of Parliamentary constituencies

The Boundary Commission for England (BCE) is the independent organisation responsible for reviewing **Parliamentary** constituency boundaries in England.

On 8th June the BCE published its proposals for new parliamentary boundaries at its website. The current review will conclude with their formal report and recommendations in June 2023, so it is referred to as the '2023 Review'. You can see a summary of the process by clicking on the 'Review process' link at the top of their web page or read a more detailed description in their <u>Guide to the 2023 Review(external link opens in a new tab)</u>. Recent changes to the law make it very likely that recommendations from this review will be implemented, so you are encouraged to participate in the process by giving your views through the BCE website.

You can use this website to:



- view current constituency and local authority boundaries.
- view BCE proposals for new constituency boundaries; and
- submit a response directly about the proposals (during a defined consultation period).

From the second consultation period onwards, you will also be able to:

- view the responses submitted by others; and
- submit a comment directly, supporting or contesting a response from somebody else.

To help you use the website effectively, BCE has produced a short and simple step by step guide: just click on the 'How to' link at the top of their web page.

Consultation is currently open until Tuesday 2nd August 2021 - please make sure to respond by that date at the latest.

This is separate to and therefore not to be confused with the current Electoral Review of Mid Sussex District Council being conducted by the Local Government Boundary Commission (England).
