<u>Disposal of Land Located at Land Adjacent to Newbury, Courtmead Road, Cuckfield (PART EXEMPT)</u>

The Deputy Leader authorised the decision:

- i. To agree the disposal of the Land via public auction.
- ii. To note the proposal to commission the auctioneer to undertake the sale on behalf of the Council.

Proposed New Lease - Units 15, Orchards Shopping Centre, Haywards Heath (EXEMPT)

The Deputy Leader:

- (a) Authorised the grant of a new lease to Gadgets4UK Enterprises Limited (trading as Fone World), mobile phone repair shop, replacing a similar trader and continuing the diversity to the retail centre at Unit 15.
- (b) Authorised the Solicitor to the Council to conclude the transaction above on the terms outlined below, and on any such other terms and conditions as the Solicitor to the Council may recommend to protect the Council's position.

Release Of S.106 Local Community Infrastructure (LCI) Contributions – Planting At Angela Fox Nature Garden

The Leader authorised the release of £6,843.45 from contributions arising from the development on land at Bylanes Close to fund the first phase of this project. for the first phase of planting in Cuckfield Parish Council's Community Garden (Angela Fox Nature Garden).

Release Of S106 Contributions - Bowers Place Playground

Environment and Service Delivery recommended that £8,520 is released to Worth Parish Council from S106 contributions arising from developments at Land at Burleys, Crabbet Park (Ref: P35/323), Land at 7 & 8 Sunny Avenue (Ref: P35/475) and Land south of Grange Road (Ref: P35/725). to install an inclusive roundabout at the Bowers Place Playground in Crawley Down.



Extension of the Licence for use as a Covid-19 Vaccination Centre to Alliance for Better Care Ltd.

The Deputy Leader authorised the grant to the extension of the licence to Alliance for Better Care Ltd to 28th February 2022 in order to continue the covid-19 vaccination program.

Proposed Grant of Lease of Part of the Fairfield Recreation Ground, Burgess Hill, West Sussex

The Deputy Leader authorised the grant of a lease of part of the Fairfield Recreation Ground, Burgess Hill to Burgess Hill Model Railway Club on the terms outlined in the report and on such other terms and conditions as the Solicitor and Head of Regulatory Services to the Council may recommend to protect the Council's position.

Burgess Hill Library Site Applications For Temporary Use

The Deputy Leader authorised the decision that having received no suitable applications for temporary use of the site within the available time frames, that the site continues to be maintained as safe and secure but left vacant.

Assets Of Community Value - The Watermill Inn, Burgess Hill

The Deputy Leader authorised the decision to list the property known as The Watermill Inn, 1 Leylands Road, Burgess Hill, West Sussex, RH15 0QF on the list of Assets of Community Value held by Mid Sussex District Council.

Information and News

COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have risen to about 65 cases per 100,000 in the last week from very low levels we had in the middle of May 2021. The increase case levels in Mid Sussex are concentrated in younger age groups and therefore hospitalisations and deaths locally are flat despite the higher case levels.

Covid rates have generally risen across West Sussex in the last week but with no areas having a rate higher than the increased England average of about 95 cases per 100,000. The average Covid rate in West Sussex is still below the South East average of about 55 cases per 100,000. Case levels in England and the South East have generally continued to rise in the last week but East Sussex has maintained low Covid levels.

In many areas of the country Covid rates are well above 100 cases per 100,000 with the Delta variant being dominant across all of England. Brighton and Hove currently have a case level above 100 cases per 100,000.

Extra efforts have been made to keep Covid levels down in these hotspot areas with surge testing and additional vaccinations for all adults in these vulnerable areas.

The third stage of the roadmap started on Monday 17th May 2021 with gyms/leisure centres, hotels and guest houses fully reopening, limited indoor home mixing and overnight stays and indoor service in pubs and restaurants. A leaflet is attached below explaining the advice to be cautious about meetings in private homes. Lateral Flow Tests are being used to identify people who have Covid but have no symptoms to try to maintain the low Covid rates now found in much of England. These free tests are available from local collection areas that can be located online or by requesting a postal delivery. Additional indoor mixing over the past five weeks and the emergence of the Delta variant have resulted in an increase in Covid levels generally in England from late May but only a small increase in, and



deaths have remained flat with 60% of the adult population being double vaccinated and over 80% having received a first vaccination and all adults now being eligible to book a jab.

The roadmap envisaged most Covid restrictions being lifted from 21st June 2021 subject to the four data tests being met. Due to the rapid rise in cases and the greater dangers of the Delta variant most of the relaxations proposed for 21st June have been delayed for 4 weeks to 19th July 2021 with a further review ahead of this date. It is important people remember Hands Face Space and Fresh Air as more people are out and about and the Covid rates have increased due to the more infectious Delta variant.

The continuing local Covid vaccination programme is central to keeping hospitalisations and Covid deaths down but indoor social mixing, the Delta variant and possible new variants of the Covid virus are likely to push the Covid figures up in the next few weeks.
