COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have risen rapidly to about 800 cases per 100,000 following outbreaks in some schools. This is well above peak level of Covid cases we had in mid-July 2021 and therefore caution is still needed in indoor settings. Hospitalisations locally and nationally are higher than in June 2021 and had been rising slowly in October 2021 but have fallen back slowly in November 2021 to date. Deaths nationally within 28 days of a positive Covid test still average over 100 per day. The highest rates of Covid remain in the school age population where regular testing is happening and Covid rates among this group have risen in the last week. Covid rates are down slightly in the 60+ population possibly as a result of the additional protection provided by booster vaccinations.

The average Covid rate across West Sussex has risen to about 570 cases per 100,000 which puts West Sussex among the highest rates in England. The increase in infection rates is among the younger population with small decreases in the older population.



The average Covid figure in England has also increased in the last week to about 410 cases per 100,000. The average Covid rate in the South East also increased in the last week to about 500 cases per 100,000. These figures are similar to the case levels in mid July 2021.

In most areas of England, Wales and Northern Ireland Covid rates remain above 400 cases per 100,000 but in the more populated areas of England and Scotland where Covid rates were higher in earlier months of the pandemic they are still mainly below 400 cases per 100,000.

Lateral flow tests are available free to collect locally or request online by post so everyone can check their Covid status and take a PCR test if the lateral flow test indicates a Covid positive result. If going to crowded indoor settings you are advised to do a lateral flow test.

People who are not double vaccinated are still required to self-isolate if they are asked to do so by Test and Trace or if they have been in recent close contact with someone who goes on to test positive for Covid. Those double vaccinated or under 18 are recommended to get a free PCR test in these circumstances but need only self-isolate if that test is positive.

About 81% of the population 12 and over in England and in Mid Sussex are now double vaccinated and about 86% of the population 12 and over have received a first vaccination.

All people 16 and over are still eligible for a Covid vaccination jab and encouraged to come forward with the second vaccinations being done after 8 weeks. Vaccinations can now be booked online for anyone 16 or over and there is a separate online booking system for those aged between 12 and 15 to get their first vaccination outside a school setting at some vaccination locations.

Otherwise Covid vaccinations for all those aged between 12 and 15 have been done in some secondary schools.

Booster vaccinations are being offered to those 40+ previously getting their second vaccination between March and June 2021, with the booster vaccination to be given about 6 months after the second vaccination was given. This means all those who had a second vaccination before June 2021 are now being called forward or those receiving a second vaccination more than 5 months ago can book their booster vaccination online. Annual flu vaccinations are now being offered through GP contact to older and vulnerable groups.

West Sussex Fire & Rescue Service has launched a public consultation around our proposals for our Community Risk Management Plan 2022 – 2026.

This document sets out the direction of the service over the next four years, and as part of this we have six proposals that we are seeking feedback on.

I would like to invite you to view these proposals and take part in our public consultation.

The proposals include:

- Enhancing our retained (on-call) operating model
- Weekend protection, prevention and response improvements
- Improving protection, prevention and response performance in rural areas
- How WSFRS should deal with false alarms from automatic fire systems
- When we should review our Emergency Response Standards
- How WSFRS proposes to undertake a review of our specialist appliance requirements to consider current and future risks to firefighter and public safety

This is a key opportunity for our communities and all partners to have their say on our proposals, and we will assess all of the responses and use to inform our final CRMP which we intend to publish in spring 2022.
