Extension of Term Contract for Mechanical and Electrical Maintenance and Reactive Repairs

The Leader approved the decision:

- 1. To initially extend the existing contract for a further six months to end of September 2022.
- 2. That if a longer period is required, to extend the contract by further 6 months using 3 month rolling options with 1 months' notice to contractor by agreement, up to a maximum overall total of 12 months to end March 2023.

COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have risen to about 1200 cases per 100,000 in the last week with the very infectious Omicron variant now accounting for almost all Covid cases. The rise in cases is across all age groups. Covid case levels remain high which means caution is needed in indoor settings which should be well ventilated. Hospitalisations of people testing positive for Covid locally and nationally remain steady across the whole of the UK and less than half of where they were in January 2021 but still about double the levels in the second half of 2021 prior to the Omicron variant. Positivity rates among those tested have now fallen below 20% in Sussex which indicates a general lowering of community Covid infections from last month. Deaths nationally, within 28 days of a positive Covid test, still average over 200 per day and is about double the number there were per week in the second half of 2021. Most adults in hospital are not fully vaccinated.

The average Covid rate across West Sussex have also risen in the last week to about 1250 cases per 100,000 and the SE rate is also 1250 cases per 100,000. The average Covid figure in England is now about 1100 cases per 100,000 with the more infectious Omicron variant now accounting for almost all Covid cases across the country. Areas with higher Covid levels can now be found right across England.

Lateral flow tests are available free to collect locally or request online by post so everyone can check their Covid status and isolate if they get a positive test. If going to crowded indoor settings you are advised to do a lateral flow test.

Plan B restrictions were lifted from 27th January 2022 but with mask wearing still advised in shops, theatres, indoor halls, churches and museums and public transport which includes taxis and private hire vehicles.

If returning from abroad fully vaccinated you are required to pay for a Lateral Flow test within 2 days of your return and if positive isolate until you get a negative lateral flow result for two successive days. If you are identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for the Omicron variant you are required to do a lateral flow tests daily for 5 days if you have had at least 2 vaccinations for Covid. Those that are not double vaccinated still have to isolate for 10 days and get a PCR test.

For those fully vaccinated a lateral flow test will not be required when returning from abroad from 11th February 2022.

About 84% of the population 12 and over in England and in Mid Sussex are now double vaccinated and about 89% of the population 12 and over have received a first vaccination. There are a significant number of people still being encouraged to come forward for their first vaccination.

All people 16 and over are still eligible for a Covid vaccination jab and encouraged to come forward with the second vaccinations being done after 8 weeks. Vaccinations can now be booked online for anyone 16 or over.



There is a separate online booking system for those aged between 12 and 15 to get their first or second vaccinations outside a school setting at some vaccination locations. Second vaccinations are advised after 3 months from the first vaccination. Otherwise Covid vaccinations for all those aged between 12 and 15 are being done again in some secondary schools.

Booster vaccinations are being offered to everyone over 12 years of age 3 months after the second vaccination on the booking system with slots now available. Walk in clinics have been opened where an appointment is not necessary. About 70% of the population 12 and over have now received their booster vaccination in Mid Sussex and England more generally. Having the booster vaccination is thought to provide greater protection against all the Covid variants and to reduce the chance of spreading the virus or being hospitalised.

Electoral Review of MSDC – LGBCE's Final Recommendations

The Local Government Boundary Commission (England) [LGBCE] has published its <u>Final</u> <u>Recommendations</u> following its Electoral Review of Mid Sussex District Council. Their findings are similar to their draft recommendations published in the autumn of last year, which were notified to Members via MIS in early September.

Subject to parliamentary approval in the Spring, the LGBCE concludes that MSDC should be comprised of 48 councillors, six fewer than there are now. There will be 27 district wards, one more than there are now. The boundaries of 23 wards should change; three (Copthorne & Worth, Hassocks and Burgess Hill St Andrews) will stay the same.

The full report of the LGBCE together with a <u>revised ward boundary map</u> and a summary report are published at the Commission's <u>website</u>. These boundary changes are due to take effect at the LG elections in May 2023. In due course, we will prepare new individual district ward maps and we will prepare the 2023 Electoral Register accordingly for its due date, 1st December 2022.

As a result of the LGBCE's final recommendations on new warding patterns, they are making changes to the parish electoral arrangements for the following parish and town councils:

- Ansty and Staplefield Parish Council
- Burgess Hill Town Council
- East Grinstead Town Council
- Havwards Heath Town Council
- Lindfield Rural Parish Council

Our draft proposals for consequential, administrative Community Governance Reviews are within the published <u>papers of our Scrutiny Committee for Customer Services & Service Delivery (2 February)</u> though the committee may resolve to defer consideration of those listed above to its subsequent meeting of 23 March 2022. This is to give parish and town councils, and other stakeholders additional time to consider the draft Terms of Reference.

We are grateful to all those who contributed to the Electoral Review during the two periods of public consultation.
