## Council Tax Support Hardship Relief - Additional Discretionary Discounts

The Cabinet Member for Leisure and Customer Services approved an additional discretionary discount from Council Tax of up to £150.00 per household for working age claimants in 2022/23, with the principles detailed in this report.

# Council Tax Support Scheme - Additional Discretionary Discounts

The Cabinet Member for Leisure and Customer Services approved the following:

- 1. That the Council Tax Support Scheme for 2022/23 is approved.
- 2. That in line with Housing Benefit the one off Test and Trace payment of £500 continues to be disregarded in full for Council Tax Support.
- 3. That the Energy Rebate payment of up to £150 is disregarded in full for Council Tax Support
- 4. That the Council Tax Support Hardship Payment of up to £150 is disregarded in full for Council Tax Support
- 5. That the published Council Tax Support Scheme (Appendix 1) for 2022/23 be approved accordingly.
- 6. That the Cabinet Member for Customer Services in consultation with the Head of Corporate Resources be given delegated authority to amend the Council's Council Tax Support scheme during 2022/23 to mirror any Housing Benefit changes.

#### **Energy Rebate Payments - Additional Discretionary Discounts**

The Cabinet Member for Leisure and Customer Services approved the decision for a discretionary energy payment scheme for the Council with payments of £150.00 per eligible household, with all the principles detailed in this report whilst funds last.

## **Information and News**

## **COVID-19 News**

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have risen to about 1000 cases per 100,000 in the last week with the very infectious Omicron 2 variant now accounting for most Covid cases. Covid case levels remain high which means caution is needed in indoor settings which should be well ventilated. Hospitalisations of people testing positive for Covid locally and nationally are up across the whole of the UK but are still about 35% less than where they were at the start of January 2022. Positivity rates among those tested are up to about 20% in Sussex which indicates a rise in community Covid infections from last week. Deaths nationally, within 28 days of a positive Covid test are steady and still average about 100 per day. Most adults in hospital are not fully vaccinated.

The average Covid rate across West Sussex has risen to about 900 cases per 100,000 with case numbers rising quickest among those 30+. Similarly, case numbers in the SE have risen to about 900 cases per 100,000. The average Covid figure in England is up to about 650 cases per 100,000 with the more infectious Omicron 2 variant now accounting for most Covid cases across the country. Many areas in the Midlands and the north of England still have Covid case levels under 500 cases per 100,000. In areas south of the Midlands Covid levels are mainly above 500 cases per 100,000 as they are across Sussex.

Case levels in Wales are still mainly below 250 cases per 100,000 but in Scotland and Northern Ireland they are all above 500 cases per 100,000 and in most parts of Scotland case levels are above 1000 cases per 100,000.

Lateral flow tests are available free to collect locally or request online by post so everyone can check their Covid status and isolate if they get a positive test. If going to crowded indoor settings you are advised to do a lateral flow test.

All Covid restrictions were lifted on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2022 but with mask wearing still advised in shops, theatres, indoor halls, churches and museums and public transport which includes taxis and private hire vehicles and self- isolation if you test positive for Covid or have cold symptoms.

About 85% of the population 12 and over in England and in Mid Sussex are now double vaccinated and about 89% of the population 12 and over have received a first vaccination. There are a significant number of people still being encouraged to come forward for their first vaccination. Covid vaccinations are being planned for the 5 to 11 age group.

Booster vaccinations are being offered to everyone over 12 years of age 3 months after the second vaccination on the booking system. Walk in clinics have been opened where an appointment is not necessary. About 71% of the population 12 and over have now received their booster vaccination in Mid Sussex and England more generally. Having the booster vaccination is thought to provide greater protection against all the Covid variants and to reduce the chance of spreading the virus or being



hospitalised. Second booster vaccinations are being planned for older people and those more vulnerable to Covid this Spring starting this month.
