#### COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have dropped to about 1200 cases per 100,000 in the last week with the very infectious Omicron 2 variant now accounting for most Covid cases. Covid case levels are high which means caution is needed in indoor settings which should be well ventilated. Hospitalisations of people testing positive for Covid locally and nationally are up across the whole of the UK but are still about 15% less than where they were at the start of January 2022. Positivity rates among those tested remain high at 25% in Sussex which indicates high community Covid infections. Deaths nationally, within 28 days of a positive Covid test, are up and now average about 145 per day.

The average Covid rate across West Sussex has fallen slightly to about 1050 cases per 100,000. Case numbers in the SE have steadied at about 1050 cases per 100,000. The average Covid figure in England is up to about 900 cases per 100,000 with the more infectious Omicron 2 variant now accounting for most Covid cases across the country. Most areas of England now have Covid case levels above 500 cases per 100,000 with levels highest in the South West where Covid levels are above 1000 cases per 100,000.

Case levels in Wales are rising but still mainly below 500 cases per 100,000. In Northern Ireland case levels are steady and average about 800 cases per 100,000.

Case levels in Scotland have steadied with average Covid rates now about 1450 cases per 100,000 but with hospitalisations higher than in other parts of the UK.

Lateral flow tests are recommended to check your Covid status and isolate if you get a positive result. If going to crowded indoor settings you are advised to do a lateral flow test.

All Covid restrictions were lifted on 24th February 2022 but with mask wearing still advised in shops, theatres, indoor halls, churches and museums and public transport which includes taxis and private hire vehicles and self-isolation if you test positive for Covid or have cold symptoms.

About 85% of the population 12 and over in England and in Mid Sussex are now double vaccinated and about 89% of the population 12 and over have received a first vaccination. There are a significant number of people still being encouraged to come forward for their first vaccination. Covid vaccinations are being planned for the 5 to 11 age group.

Booster vaccinations are being offered to everyone over 12 years of age 3 months after the second vaccination on the booking system. Walk in clinics have been opened where an appointment is not necessary. About 72% of the population 12 and over have now received their booster vaccination in Mid Sussex and England more generally. Having the booster vaccination is thought to provide greater protection against all the Covid variants and to reduce the chance of spreading the virus or being hospitalised.

Second booster vaccinations have started for vulnerable people and those over 75 who had their first booster vaccination over 6 months ago.
