## **Information and News**

#### **COVID-19 News**

Covid is now endemic, and we are working to live with it. Covid rates in West Sussex have come down in the last week and now average about 140 cases per 100,000. The fall in cases is slowest among older age groups who are more likely to get seriously ill with Covid. With Covid rates still relatively high and the average death rate of those testing positive for Covid within 28 days of death still above 200 per day, people are still advised to remain cautious in busy indoor areas where ventilation is important. Mask wearing in busy indoor settings is still advised. The number of people in hospital with Covid has fallen by about 1/2 over the last 3 weeks and the number of Covid tests proving positive has fallen from about 25% at the end of March to about 8% at the beginning of May.

Those with Covid symptoms are asked to self- isolate until those symptoms have passed to safeguard others. Lateral Flow tests will indicate when you are most infectious with Covid and remain free in medical and care home settings.

The best way to avoid serious illness from a Covid infection is to maintain the benefits of vaccination. Those over 75 and Covid vulnerable adults are now being called forward for a second booster vaccination 6 months after their first booster vaccination with online bookings and some drop in centres including at Clair Hall. Covid vaccinations are also now available for 5 to 11 year olds to help reduce the spread of Covid in the community. In West Sussex about 10% of the population 12 and over remains without any Covid vaccinations and those people continue to be encouraged to come forward given they make up a large % of the people in hospital seriously ill with Covid. Being fully vaccinated makes overseas travel more straightforward and reduces the need for privately sourced Covid tests as part of the travel requirements.
