<u>Update on Licensing Dog Boarding Franchises in the Mid Sussex District Council Area</u>

Under the Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities Involving Animals) (England) Regulations 2018 the Council are required to licence dog boarding premises which includes people offering their services to board dogs in their private homes as a business. This does not affect arrangements where a neighbour or family member looks after dogs during a holiday or similar period.

Dog Boarding Franchises are a popular variant of home boarding. Where a Head Office of the franchise will advertise premises where dogs can be boarded (these sites are known as 'host premises'). The head office and the host premises can be located anywhere within the country and the dog owners can book through the franchise company for one of the host premises to home board the dog. At this time there are six potential premises in the MSDC area.

Since October 2018 there has been some debate on whether the host premises needs to be licenced if the Dog Boarding Franchise has a licence. In effect would they come under the umbrella of the Franchisee's licence?

Mid Sussex District Council has obtained Counsel's opinion on this. Counsel's opinion is that, the Dog Boarding Franchise and the host premises need to have separate licences as they both meet the activity and business test detailed in the regulations.

Accordingly the Licensing Team will be advising such businesses that any premises in the district providing dog boarding using this model will be required to be licensed independently from the franchise head office.
