Review of Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations 2019 [Mid Sussex District]

We have launched our compulsory 5 year review of polling districts and polling stations and you are invited to contribute any representations you may wish to make about our polling scheme. Please do so as soon as possible, but in any case by 29th November 2019. Our public notice, terms of reference, the current polling scheme and the Returning Officer's proposal are available to read here.

The Representation of the People Act 1983 (RPA 1983) requires that all local authorities review their UK Parliamentary polling districts and polling places at least once every five years. Our previous review was conducted in late 2013 and reported to Council in early 2014.

The Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013 introduced a change to scheduled timings in that the current compulsory review must be started and completed between 1 October 2018 and 31 January 2020 (inclusive). We have scheduled this review to begin today so that it occurs between the scheduled local and other elections of 2019 and 2020. We do appreciate that anticipation is building about additional, unscheduled electoral events, but in case of such event(s) this review would not be unduly affected. It would proceed and complete as planned.

For your information:

- A polling district is a geographical area created by the sub-division of a UK Parliamentary constituency for the purposes of a UK Parliamentary election. In England, each parish is to be a separate polling district.
- A polling place is the building or area in which polling stations will be selected by the (Acting)
 Returning Officer. A polling place within a polling district must be designated so that polling
 stations are within easy reach of all electors from across the polling district.
- A polling station is the room or area within the polling place where voting takes place. Unlike
 polling districts and polling places which are fixed by the local authority, polling stations are
 chosen by the relevant Returning Officer for the election.

Local authorities must also comply with the following access requirements. As part of the review, they must:

- seek to ensure that all electors in a constituency in the local authority area have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances
- seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable every polling place for which it is responsible is accessible to electors who are disabled

The council must have regard to the accessibility to disabled persons of potential polling stations in any place which it is considering designating as a polling place or the designation of which as a polling place it is reviewing. The Council therefore welcomes representation from any person or body with expertise in access for people with any type of disability. Persons or bodies making representations should, if possible, indicate any alternative locations that can be used as polling places and polling stations.

We very much hope that you will contribute to this review and we look forward to hearing from you.
