Information and News

COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have dropped from their peak shortly after Christmas and have steadied over the past week at about 75 cases per 100,000 and therefore after 7 weeks of lockdown Mid Sussex has a similar infection rate as it had in early October 2020. However, Covid rates have continued to fall in other Sussex authorities in the past week.

This rapid fall from very high Covid levels at the start of 2021 is reflected across England. A majority of authorities in Sussex and the South East now have Covid rates below 70 cases per 100,000 which means the South East average is below the England average of about 100 cases per 100,000. Some authorities in Sussex now have the Covid levels below 50 cases per 100,000 but Crawley and Arun still have Covid levels above the England average and therefore overall West Sussex remains above the South East Covid average but below the England Covid average. More Sussex Authorities should have rates below 50 cases per 100,000 in the next 12 days which are similar to the levels seen in Sussex last August.

Both hospitalisations and Covid death rates continue to fall in Sussex from the very high levels seen in late January and are now similar to those seen last Autumn. The expanding local Covid vaccination programme will assist in bringing hospitalisations and Covid deaths down but there is a risk that new variants and the "Kent" variant of the Covid virus will push these figures in the opposite direction when restrictions start to be lifted from 8th March 2021 with schools reopening. This week most people



aged 65 to 69 will have received their first vaccination. The vaccination of more vulnerable people aged 16 to 64 will continue into March alongside the second vaccination for those people vaccinated at the beginning of the vaccination programme in December 2020/ January 2021.

Question arising from Cabinet 8 February 2021

At this meeting Officers were asked whether there had been a positive financial impact from the acquisition of the Council's own Temporary Accommodation. Analysis of the last year's figures show that the total cost of temporary accommodation has been reduced by £55K for the 10 month position to date, extrapolated to be £67K by year end, reducing a forecast deficit of £163K to £97K. This arises from owning our own properties as an alternative to bed and breakfast and hotel accommodation.
