Proposed New Lease – Units 24, Orchards Shopping Centre, Haywards Heath (EXEMPT)

The Deputy Leader:

- (a) Authorised the grant of a new lease to Acorn Sales & Lettings Ltd, Estate Agents at Unit 24 for a term of 2 years.
- (b) Authorised the Solicitor to the Council to conclude the transaction above on the terms outlined below, and on any such other terms and conditions as the Solicitor to the Council may recommend to protect the Council's position.

Proposed New Lease – Units 25, Orchards Shopping Centre, Haywards Heath (EXEMPT)

The Deputy Leader:

- (a) Authorise the grant of a new lease to Essence Hair Ltd at Unit 25 for a term of 5 years from the 21st February 2021.
- (b) Authorise the Solicitor to the Council to conclude the transaction above on the terms outlined below, and on any such other terms and conditions as the Solicitor to the Council may recommend to protect the Council's position.

Variation to Lease – Unit LSU1, Orchards Shopping Centre, Haywards Heath (EXEMPT)

- (a) Authorised a variation of the lease terms to provide a revised rent clause allowing Marks & Spencer PLC to continue to pay the rent monthly in advance, as an alternative to the Quarterly rent as stated in the lease terms, which are due for the March quarter.
- (b) Authorised the Solicitor to the Council to conclude the transaction above on the terms outlined below, and on any such other terms and conditions as the Solicitor to the Council may recommend to protect the Council's position.



<u>Release of S106 Local Community Infrastructure (LCI) contributions – Installation of Bus</u> <u>Shelters and Notice Board</u>

The Cabinet Member for Housing and Planning approved the release of £7,548.05 from the development on Land at Sandrocks to fund the purchase and installation of two bus shelters and a noticeboard near Cedar Avenue, Rocky Lane, Haywards Heath.

Adjustment of Local Land Charges Official Search Fee

The Cabinet Member for Community approved the increase of the overall search fee from £111.00 to £113.40 (including VAT) to reflect the volume and variety of search enquiries, together with staffing levels required to provide a responsive service to meet the needs of the property market.

The Cabinet Member for Community approved the Revised Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy attached in Appendix 1 for adoption on the 1st May 2021.

COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex have dropped from their peak shortly after Christmas and are now about 25 cases per 100,000 and therefore after 9 weeks of lockdown Mid Sussex has a similar infection rate as it had in mid - September 2020. Covid rates have fallen in all other Sussex authorities in the past week.

This rapid fall from very high Covid levels at the start of 2021 is reflected across England. A majority of authorities in Sussex and the South East now have Covid rates below 25 cases per 100,000 which means the South East average is below the England average of about 50 cases per 100,000. Crawley and Arun still have Covid levels above the England average but overall West Sussex is about at the South East Covid average of 40 cases per 100,000.

The first stage of the roadmap started this Monday with schools re-opening in accordance with the road map attached. In addition, appropriate political campaigning (leafleting and canvassing) for the May elections is now permitted. Lateral Flow Tests are being used to identify people who have Covid but have no symptoms to try to maintain the low current Covid rates.



Both hospitalisations and Covid death rates continue to fall in Sussex from the very high levels seen in late January and are now similar to those seen last October.

The expanding local Covid vaccination programme will assist in bringing hospitalisations and Covid deaths down but there is a risk that new variants and the "Kent" variant of the Covid virus will push these figures in the opposite direction as restrictions start to be lifted from 8th March 2021.

People aged 55 and over are now eligible for their first vaccination. The vaccination of more medically vulnerable people aged 16 to 64 will continue alongside the second vaccination for those people vaccinated at the beginning of the vaccination programme in December 2020/January 2021.
