#### COVID-19 News

Covid levels in Mid Sussex remain under 25 cases per 100,000 and therefore Mid Sussex has a similar infection rate as it had in mid - September 2020. Covid rates have fallen in Worthing and Arun over the past week but increased in Chichester. The average Covid rate in West Sussex has fallen over the past week and is below the South East average of about 35 cases per 100,000.

This rapid fall from very high Covid levels at the start of 2021 is reflected across England but in parts of the north and the East Midlands Covid rates are still above 100 cases per 100,000 with some increases in the past week.

A majority of authorities in Sussex now have Covid rates below 25 cases per 100,000 which means the Sussex average is well below the England average of about 50 cases per 100,000. However, Crawley and Eastbourne still have Covid levels around the England average.

The first stage of the roadmap started on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2021 with schools re-opening. In addition, appropriate political campaigning for the May elections was permitted. Lateral Flow Tests are being used to identify people who have Covid but have no symptoms to try to maintain the low Covid rates at the beginning of March 2021 which to date has been successful. Since the 29<sup>th</sup> March 2021 groups of 6 or two households are allowed to meet outside including private gardens and outdoor sports such as golf and tennis are now open again. The emphasis is on keeping things in the fresh air where transmission of the virus is less likely and maintaining Hands, Face and Space. Subject to the data permitting the next step of the roadmap is on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> April when non-essential shops should reopen alongside outdoor service in pubs and restaurants.

Both hospitalisations and Covid death rates continue to fall in Sussex from the very high levels seen in late January and are now heading to the low levels seen last September.

The continuing local Covid vaccination programme will assist in bringing hospitalisations and Covid deaths down further but there is a risk that new variants of the Covid virus will push these figures in the opposite direction as restrictions are lifted further in the next few weeks.

All people aged 50 and over are eligible for their first vaccination. The vaccination of more medically vulnerable people aged 16 to 49 alongside the second vaccination for those people first vaccinated in January/February 2021 will continue in April.

All people aged 40 and over will be invited to book a Covid vaccination in April as vaccine supplies permit.

#### Census 2021 update

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) have provided the Council with an initial snapshot of return rates for Mid Sussex, taken on 24 March. Based on the ONS 'Lower Level Super Output Areas' that are loosely comparable to parish areas, a generally above average picture of return rates is shown, with couple of 'amber' areas around western Copthorne and south of Haywards Heath which may be explained by the presence of active housing development sites. A further snapshot is due to be taken on 7 April which should provide a clearer picture of the overall response rate, once paper returns start to be received by the ONS.



Census ground staff are now actively working across the district to follow up on 'no-response' households and members may well have seen them out and about, they are clearly identifiable with Census tabards, ID and mobile devices. It is worth reminding members of the ONS guidance on what a member of the public should be aware of if they are concerned that the person on their doorstep is not a genuine census official:

- Census officers will carry an ID card with their photograph and name
- Census officers will work through the day to make contact with residents but will not call before 09:00 or after 20:00
- Census officers will never ask for money or bank details
- Census officers will never need to enter someone's home
- Census officers will have census leaflets and paper questionnaires with them

Whilst the Council's main approach is to continue to direct residents to www.census.gov.uk or the national helpline: 0800 141 2021; if members are contacted by distressed elderly or infirmed residents who require a paper form and are without internet access and unable to get through to the national helpline, they can be advised to call the District Council Contact Centre on 01444 458166. The Contact Centre staff will be able to order a household form for them using the online process, which will be delivered by post.

#### Electoral Review of Mid Sussex District Council is Live

On Tuesday 23 March 2021, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) launched its Electoral Review of Mid Sussex District Council. It begins with a period of public consultation on council size and warding patterns. This is the first of two substantial consultation periods and it is open from 23 March 2021 until 31 May 2021. Residents, community groups and political stakeholders are encouraged to engage with the Review.

There is advice on <u>LGBCE's website</u> about how to get involved with the consultation. The website features <u>technical guidance</u> that explains the process and LGBCE's policies, as well as guidance on how to take part at each stage. They have set up a <u>webpage</u> dedicated to the Review of Mid Sussex, where all the relevant information is available.

Interactive maps of the current ward boundaries across Mid Sussex are available on LGBCE's <u>specialist consultation portal</u>. The portal allows participants to comment and upload documents directly to the site.

#### Regulated election period begins on Monday 29th March 2021

Members will be aware that scheduled local elections and the deferred Police & Crime Commissioner election are due to take place on Thursday 6 May 2021. The regulated election period started on Monday 29th March 2021. Attached for Members and Officers to note is important advice from the Monitoring Officer, Tom Clark, explaining restrictions on the Council's public activities during this period of heightened political sensitivity.
